The Right Message

- Use information from credible, scientific and known sources.
 - *MaDPH, CDC, NIH
- Use consistant messaging
 - * instills trust
- Be simple and concise
 - * understand the patient, language barriers, education level
- Stay up to date
 - * know the lastest information

The Right Person

- Public Health/ PHN
 - *Nurses are the most trusted medical professional (Gallup Dec 26, 2017)
 but Public Health is Government.
 - *community relationship
- Physician
 - *Like/dislike- clean bill of health vs. multiple tests, inconclusive or bad diagnosis
 - *Big Pharma, limited access, inconvenient
- Pharmacist
 - *Knowledgeable about medicine and the patients medical history
 - *Relatively new to providing immunizations on site but more convenient than PCP or PH

The Right Time

- Every patient encounter
 - Maybe not every one....
- Life experiences
 - Entering college, expecting a baby/grandchild, specific diagnosis
- Seasonal/Outbreak
 - Flu, hepatitis, meningitis
